





We are happy to report that 11 of the 40 beneficiaries completed their high school education awaiting to join tertiary colleges and Higher institutes of learning this year. NEWS UPDATE

In mid-February 2020, Kenya reported the first cases of Covid – 19 virus outbreaks. The outbreak and spread of the disease have greatly negatively impacted the Kenyan economy and the world at large. The outbreak in Kenya led to the shutdown of Schools, businesses and other opportunities. To those dwelling in the Mathare slums it has been a great challenge on their livelihood. The slum dwellers depend on their daily earnings by doing low-wage jobs like washing clothes and cleaning of houses which are not available now due to the pandemic. This has made it hard for them to put food on the table hence they face hunger problems. We have parents/guardians coming to the office every day looking for food support; we thank God because we have friends who have supported the initiative of by helping with food donations although not enough.

KTSSC is greatly grateful to all the well-wishers who have chipped in by donating food stuffs to our office for distribution to the needy slum dwellers. See the photos below.
